I conducted a special investigation because the child care licensing bureau received a complaint against your facility that related to licensing rules or law. The allegations were related to the following:

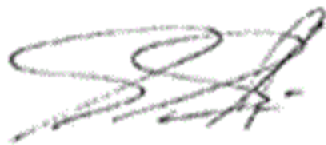

**ALLEGATION:** Appropriate care and supervision were not provided to Child A when Child B touched her atop her clothing on her genitals. Appropriate care and supervision were not provided to Child C when Child B attempted to look at her toileting beneath the bathroom stall.

**INVESTIGATION:**

On 8/24/2023 I made an onsite inspection at the Education Station of Wayland child care center. During the onsite I interviewed the program director Yvonne Pardee, and child care staff member (CCSM) 1.

During the interview with Yvonne Pardee, she acknowledged the allegations were true to the best of her knowledge. Yvonne Pardee was on vacation during the week the incident occurred. While she was off, Yvonne Pardee advised the program director for the Education Station located in Dorr, Kaylan Atens filled in as the temporary program

director. Yvonne Pardee stated it was her understanding that after hours, CCSM 1, who has a personal relationship with Child A's Mother, received a text message from Child A's Mother on the evening of 8/22/2023. Within the text message Child A's Mother informed CCSM 1 that Child A made a disclosure that she had been touched (on her body) by Child B. Child A also made the disclosure that she told Child B to stop touching her and that she also told the CCSMs who placed Child B in timeout. Child A's Mother then stated she was going to speak with Yvonne Pardee in the morning.

After her discussion with Child A's Mother, Yvonne Pardee contacted Kaylan Atens and informed her of Child A's disclosure. Yvonne Pardee requested Kaylan Atens draft the incident report as she was overseeing the operations of the child care center on the day of the incident. Kaylan Atens then spoke to the bureau's consultant to inform her of the allegations received in addition to contacting the Wayland Police Department (WPD). When [REDACTED] arrived at the child care facility he was informed that during the previous week there were only two days when Child A and Child B were both present. During these two days, CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 were the only CCSMs that worked in the classroom with Child A and Child B. [REDACTED] interviewed CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 onsite. Neither CCSM 1 nor CCSM 2 reported having any knowledge of Child A informing them of the incident that occurred between Child A and Child B, and both CCSMs denied witnessing anything occur between Child A and Child B. Yvonne Pardee advised she has a child that is enrolled in the school-age classroom. Yvonne Pardee's child denied witnessing any inappropriate interactions between Child A and Child B. Based upon the severity of the allegations, Yvonne Pardee stated Child B was disenrolled from the child care facility.

Prior to ending the interview Yvonne Pardee also stated prior to the alleged incident with Child A and Child B, another child made an allegation regarding Child B. On 8/5/2023 Yvonne Pardee reported Child C's Mother made a complaint that Child B has been looking under the bathroom stall while Child C was using the bathroom. However, the following day Child C's Mother sent a message through the ProCare app informing the child care center that Child C admitted to lying about Child B looking at her under the bathroom stall. Due to the disclosure received from Child C's Mother, the child care facility did not continue looking into the incident.

CCSM 1 was provided with the allegations concerning Child A and Child B. CCSM 1 identified herself and CCSM 2 and the CCSMs that primarily work in the school-age classroom. CCSM1 denied witnessing Child A and Child B associate with one another, and she had never witnessed Child B being "touchy" with any of the child care children. While discussing Child A's disclosure that she told the CCSMs and as a result Child B was placed in time-out, CCSM 1 denied any disclosure was made to her or CCSM 2. CCSM 1 also made a point to note she and Child A's Mother had a friendship and she would not have withheld this information from her. While discussing Child A and Child B CCSM 1 denied there were any serious behavioral concerns for either child. CCSM 1 relayed Child B would get upset or frustrated on occasion, but denied he exhibited any behaviors like what was reported in the allegations.

On 8/24/2023 I received an email from the [REDACTED] is the assigned [REDACTED] assigned to Child B. [REDACTED] requested to consult regarding Child B as he is an [REDACTED]

On 8/25/2023 I received an email from Yvonne Pardee. Yvonne Pardee provided me with a copy of the child information cards requested as well as text message exchanges that occurred between Child A's Mother and CCSM 1, and a screenshot posted to the ProCare app by Child C's Mother. Reviewing the attachments, I was able to read Child A's Mother's disclosure concerning Child B. I also obtained a copy of the screenshot posted to the ProCare app by Child C's Mother where she declined to pursue the allegation, she brought to the center's attention due to Child C admitting the allegations were not true.

10/20/2023 I spoke to the Wayland Police Department's (WPD) Administrative Assistant [REDACTED]. During the phone call I requested a copy of the incident report 1773-23.

On 10/20/2023 I received an email from the WPD's Administrative Assistant [REDACTED]. The email contained two attachments, the original and supplemental report drafted by [REDACTED]. Within the original report [REDACTED] noted his interview that occurred with Child B's Guardians. The report stated neither guardian of Child A had previous concerns related to Child B and inappropriate contact and/or sexualized behavior. Child B's Guardians advised Child B also denied physical contact occurred between himself and Child A.

Within the supplemental report drafted by [REDACTED] documented Child A's Mother declined to have Child A undergo an additional forensic interview at Safe Harbor. The supplemental report also noted during Child B's forensic interview at Safe Harbor, he made no disclosures regarding abuse.

On 10/20/2023 I spoke to Child A's Mother; Child D and Child E's Mother; Child F's Mother; Child G's Mother; CCSM 2; CCSM 3; and the Education Station of Dorr program director, Kaylan Atens.

Child A's Mother provided a recount of the incident that occurred on 8/22/2023. Child A's Mother confirmed that the information within the complaint was factual. Child A's Mother believed something was wrong with Child A after she came home and began behavioral difficulties. She observed that Child A was detached, worried, and upset. She began asking questions regarding the child care facility to see if there was anything occurring that she should be aware of. Child A's Mother has previously discussed body safety with Child A and immediately began discussing it with Child A. Child A's Mother asked Child A directly "if anyone touched her," she continued "and she said what no parent ever wants to hear." Child A disclosed that Child B had "touched her a lot of times" within the classroom. She then clarified that she did not believe Child A had been touched on multiple occasions. Based upon her conversation with Child A, Child A's

Mother believed it was more likely that Child A was touched on multiple locations on her body during one incident.

During the conversation Child A denied she was ever touched beneath her clothing and identified "between her legs, her butt, and her chest" as being the locations where she was touched. Child A's Mother said Child A informed her that she told CCSM 1 about the incident. However, Child A's Mother didn't believe she told CCSM 1. Child A's Mother disclosed having a personal relationship with CCSM 1 and didn't believe she would withhold that information from her. Child A's Mother believed Child A was not honest about this because she may have thought she would get in trouble for not reporting Child B touched her.

I asked Child A's Mother if she was aware of any specific toileting procedures that they follow. She also denied being aware of the toileting procedures in the classroom, but she was aware that the bathroom the children use is located within the classroom. She told me that it was also a gender-neutral bathroom, which she did not like. Child A's Mother believed that school age children should have separate bathrooms, or at a minimum not have mixed gender children in the bathroom at the same time. Child A's Mother then clarified her statement at my request, and she said she's witnessed both boys and girls in the bathroom together on occasion. I asked Child A's Mother if Child A had been touched in the bathroom. Child A's Mother was not aware of the location where Child A was touched, and declined my request that she ask Child A. Child A's Mother said Child A was doing well and that she did not want to bring up the matter and set her back. I then asked if Child A's Mother believed that the lack of supervision contributed to Child A being touched by Child B which she denied. Child A's Mother reported having been previously employed in a child care setting and said these matters can occur quickly.

Child C has been attending the child care facility for approximately three months. During this time Child C's Mother has had a "pretty positive" experience at the Education Station. Child B's Mother told me there was an incident at the beginning of August where Child C has been attempting to look under the bathroom stall while she was inside. Prior to this occurring Child B's Mother stated there were small incidents that had occurred that Child B's Mother had "a weird feeling about," but explained it was not anything serious enough to bring to Yvonne Pardee's attention. Child C's Mother explained the weird behavior and disclosed it felt as if Child B had been targeting her by way of playing with toys close to her proximity and making them hit her.

Child C's Mother acknowledged being aware that multiple child care children will often be in the bathroom together. She did not believe this was a good idea, but also relayed she did not believe it important enough to make a complaint to the facility. As time progressed, at the beginning of August Child C reported an incident that occurred while Child C was using the bathroom. Child C disclosed Child B was attempting to look at her while she was using the bathroom by peaking under the stall. After hearing this, Child C's Mother immediately contacted the child care facility to report the incident. While Child C's Mother was attempting to gather more information about the incident,

Child C then disclosed she was not telling the truth. Child C's Mother then contacted the child care facility the following day through the ProCare app and informed Yvonne Pardee of Child C's most recent disclosure and asked that the incident not be investigated. Since this time, Child C's Mother denied there have been any additional incidents concerning Child B.

Despite Child C's Mother said mixed genders in the bathroom at the same time, due to there being two separate stalls, was not a "huge concern" but still maintained believing it was not best practice to have the children sharing and using the bathroom at the same time. Child C's Mother did not believe that the child care center failed to provide appropriate care and supervision for the school aged children.

Child D and Child E have been attending the child care facility since August of 2021. While Child D only attended child care for the summer, Child D and Child E's Mother informed me Child E was still in attendance and enrolled in the 4's room. Child D and Child E's Mother does not have any "major complaints" for the facility. Child D and Child C's Mother identified CCSM 1 as the CCSM that is most frequently in the school-age classroom. She also stated Yvonne Pardee will has also worked in the school-age room on occasion. Child D and Child E's Mother did not have concerns with the CCSMs not reporting incidents and told me they often post updates through the ProCare app in real time. Child D and Child C's Mother also stated Child E recently had an injury while in care and that in addition to notifying her through the app, they also called and spoke with her, so she was aware. Child D and Child E's Mother has not witnessed any negative changes in either child's behavior since attending. Child D and Child E's Mother acknowledged reviewing body safety with Child D and what were appropriate touches and inappropriate touches. Child D and Child E's Mother would "hope" Child D and Child E would communicate with her. While Child D and Child E's Mother did not believe this was an issue that impacted Child D while in the school age room, she was again going to discuss body safety with Child D and Child E.

Child F's Mother informed me that Child F has been attending the child care facility for approximately 7 years. Child F's Mother has had an "awesome" experience since Child F has been attending. Currently Child F only attends for before and after school care, and she denied having any concerns regarding the care and supervision provided to the children at the child care facility. Child F's Mother denied having concerns pertaining to the child care facility reporting incidents saying they "constantly upload things to ProCare throughout the day."

Child G's Mother reported being a former CCSM at the child care facility, and advised Child G no longer attends the facility. Child G's Mother worked at the child care facility for approximately 2 years. Child G's Mother said she left for a "variety of reasons." She elaborated on this and stated she "didn't feel it was run well; they don't follow licensing rules; and a lot of things [they] don't agree with. Child G's Mother specifically stated the school age room was not "structured" and that the CCSMs located in the room don't provide good supervision. What bothered Child G's Mother more than anything else was the lack of supervision the CCSMs provide to the children. As an example of this, Child

G's Mother believed it was inappropriate to have children of mixed genders being in the bathroom at the same time without supervision. On occasion, Child G's Mother would have a difficulty finding CCSMs in the classroom upon arrival. While Child G's Mother denied the children ever being alone in the facility without care, she stated the CCSMs would often be located in areas where they are not able to monitor the children's locations.

Child G's Mother identified CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 as being the CCSMs that are primarily working in the school-age room. Child G's Mother did not personally work with either CCSM often but advised CCSM 1 had a close relationship with Child G. Child G's Mother said CCSM 1 was "always engaged" while actively working with the children, but stated CCSM 2 did not appear to pay much attention to the children. Child G's Mother acknowledged both CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 are often on their phones. Child G's Mother confirmed being aware of the investigation and allegations made that Child B touched Child A and attempted to look at Child C beneath the bathroom stall. Child G's Mother believed the incidents that occurred with Child A and Child C were preventable should CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 monitor the bathrooms more closely.

During the phone interviews with the child care parents it was mentioned that I should reach out to CCSM 3 who could provide me with additional information pertaining to the care and supervision within the center.

CCSM 2 has been employed at the Education Station of Wayland for approximately 2 years. In that time CCSM 2 has primarily worked in the school-age room, but acknowledged she has more recently worked in the school-age room. CCSM 2 recalled the incident noted in the allegations. Child A made a disclosure to Child A's Mother that Child B had touched her on multiple locations on her body, but denied there was skin-to-skin contact between Child A and Child B during the incident. CCSM 2 denied having any awareness of the alleged incident until the following day when Child A's Mother spoke to the interim program director, Kaylan Atens. CCSM 2 denied Child A brought the incident to the attention of herself or CCSM 1. If this incident had been reported, CCSM 2 stated an incident report would have been drafted and they would have notified Child A's Mother through the ProCare app in addition to consulting with her during Child A's pickup. CCSM 2 recalled there was a separate incident that occurred concerning Child B shortly before the disclosure made by Child A. Child C informed Child C's Mother that Child B was attempting to watch Child C beneath the bathroom stall. CCSM 2 also denied this was brought to the CCSMs attention, but advised Child B's Mother later informed the child care center that Child C admitted to making up the allegations. CCSM 2 denied there were any previous concerns exhibited by Child A, Child B, or Child C that would have required the CCSMs to provide increased supervision while toileting.

CCSM 2 confirmed that the school-age children all use the same bathroom located in the classroom. She continued to state that they "usually" have a CCSM standing outside the bathroom when there are children of mixed genders using the bathroom. CCSM 2 said it was not common for the CCSMs to allow mixed-gendered children in

the bathroom together but stated it has happened during urgent situations. I then asked CCSM 2 about the allegations concerning the child care children playing in the bathrooms. CCSM 2 acknowledged this has been a problem and that whenever they notice multiple children in the bathroom, they always come over to provide supervision. CCSM 2 also confirmed there have been several previous incidents where they have found the child care children "horsing around."

CCSM 3 requested that the conversation be anonymous out of concern that providing the information to the Bureau could result in conflicts amongst the CCSMs. CCSM 3 did not have concerns regarding "management" but has had concern regarding care and supervision with the school-age classroom.

CCSM 3 reported having familiarity with both CCSM 1 and CCSM 2. CCSM 3 stated "some days they are fantastic and great, but a lot of times they're on their phones." While CCSM 3 has observed both CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 on their phones she believed it was difficult to determine whether the CCSMs are updating the ProCare app as opposed to "texting." CCSM 3 said while it can be difficult to tell, she acknowledged there have been times where the CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 have been on their phone longer than what she would expect for documenting in the app. While CCSM 1 has been observed occasionally using her phone, she believed CCSM 2's use of her phone was more excessive compared to CCSM 1. During the interview CCSM 3 confirmed there have been multiple children in the bathroom at the same time. Whenever the CCSMs have noticed this, they always make the children leave the bathroom. CCSM 3 did not believe the incident involving Child A and Child B occurred solely due CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 not paying attention in the classroom. CCSM 3 said the children can move around the room quickly, and that it would be impossible to prevent the children from always entering the bathroom together. Aside from the frequency and/or duration that CCSM 1 and CCSM 2 are on their phones, CCSM 3 denied having any concerns. She believed CCSM 1 was more attentive and that she "plays and interacts" with the children more than CCSM 2.

Kaylan Atens provided her account of what occurred during the incident between Child A and Child B. Kaylan Atens identified herself as the program director for the Dorr Education Station, but advised she was also working at the Wayland location filling in for Yvonne Pardee while she was on leave. Kaylan Atens denied being aware of the allegations that Child B touched Child A in multiple locations atop her clothing while they were both in the school-aged bathroom which is located inside the classroom. Kaylan Atens discovered what occurred on the following day when Child A's Mother came in to the facility. While discussing the matter with Child A's Mother, she told Kaylan Atens that Child A would no longer be attending the child care facility if Child A and Child B remained in the same classroom. After her discussion with Child A's Mother, Kaylan Atens spoke with Child B concerning the incident. During her conversation with Child B, Kaylan Atens stated Child B admitted to the touching Child A with an open hand. Though, Child B would not disclose the location on Child A's body where she was touched. After Child B's disclosure and acknowledgment that he touched Child A, Kaylan Atens informed him she was going to report the incident to Child B's Guardian.

As soon as Kaylan Atens made the comment, Child B refused to continue talking and would not identify the location on Child A's body where he touched her. Kaylan Atens advised that after discussing the matter with the owner/licensee Tod Wedyke it was decided that Child B would be discharged from the child care facility. I then discussed the allegations that were previously made (and recanted) concerning Child B watching Child C use the bathroom from beneath the stall. Kaylan Atens stated she was familiar with this but was not working at the Wayland location at the time and could not provide any additional information pertaining to what occurred.

On 10/20/2023 I left a voicemail message for Child B's Guardian, and Child J's Mother. Prior to the conclusion of the investigation, I was unable to establish contact with Child B's Guardian or Child J's Mother.

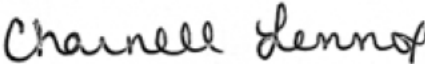
On 10/25/2023 I conducted an exit conference with Yvonne Pardee via phone conversation. During the exit conference I provided Yvonne Pardee with technical assistance to develop a better procedure to assure there is proper supervision in the classroom bathroom.

On 10/31/2023 I conferenced with the [REDACTED] regarding the special investigation disposition pertaining to Child B.
