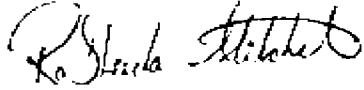

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children's records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.8128**Staff; volunteer; tuberculosis.**

A center shall keep on file at the center evidence to verify that each child care staff member and each volunteer who has contact with children at least 4 hours per week for more than 2 consecutive weeks is free from communicable tuberculosis (TB). Verification of TB status is required within 1 year before employment or volunteering.

Two of the staff members did not have a TB on file.

R 400.8131**Professional development requirements.**

(5) Within 90 days of being hired, or the first day as an unsupervised volunteer, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall complete the following trainings, which may count toward annual professional development hours and are available at MiRegistry:

- (a) Administration of medication.
- (b) Prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions.
- (c) Building and physical premises safety.
- (d) Emergency preparedness and response planning.
- (e) Handling and storage of hazardous materials and appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants.
- (f) Precautions in transporting children, if applicable.
- (g) Child development.

A total of 7 staff members hired longer than 90 days did not have the required trainings identified in this room on file.

R 400.8134**Hand washing.**

- (2) All staff and volunteers shall wash their hands at all of the following times:
- (g) After handling bodily fluids.

I observed Ms. Saunders wipe a child in the infant room running nose. She did not wash her hands afterwards.

She did utilize hand sanitizer.

R 400.8152 Medication; administrative procedures.

(2) A child care staff member shall give or apply medication, prescription or nonprescription, only with prior written permission from a parent.

A total of five nonprescription medicines such as Tylenol and Motrin were on file and labeled for a designated child without a parent permission.

R 400.8315 Food and equipment storage.

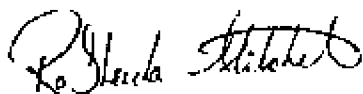
(1) Each refrigerator must have an accurate working thermometer indicating a temperature of 41 degrees Fahrenheit or below.

The thermometer in the infant room read 50 degrees Fahrenheit. The temperature was noticeable low, and condensation was observed inside the back of the refrigerator.

While onsite, a different refrigerator from another room was placed in the infant room. There was a working thermometer and it read under 41 degrees Fahrenheit.

I recommend no change to the status of the license.
