III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center’s records, including staff records and children’s records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children’s records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

When I arrived on site, there was one child care staff member present with 9 children. There were concerns for supervision as a child was attempting to open the door when I rang the doorbell. Upon entering the center, I observed the child care staff member to be in the multi-purpose room with some children while other children were in the classroom working on an art project without direct supervision. The child care staff member appeared to be distracted with the upcoming graduation

decorations and missed a child eating a snack during worktime. I observed free play, art and singing.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.8112 Comprehensive background check; fingerprinting.

(1) Pursuant to section 5n of the act, MCL 722.115n, before an individual has unsupervised contact with children, the department shall determine the individual's eligibility to be any of the following:

- (a) A licensee.
- (b) A licensee designee.
- (c) A child care staff member.
- (d) A child care aide.
- (e) An unsupervised volunteer.

Ms. Stout failed to ensure child care staff member Shelby Jessup was determined to be eligible before having unsupervised contact as a child care staff member.

R 400.8112 Comprehensive background check; fingerprinting.

(2) An applicant or licensee shall do all of the following:

(a) Ensure that each individual who requires an eligibility determination under subrule (1) of this rule completes, signs, and submits all of the information required in subrule (5) of this rule, and in subrule (6) of this rule if applicable, on a form prescribed by the department. The forms are available on the department's website for the child care background check system, www.michigan.gov/ccbc. The form or forms must be signed and dated prior to the individual's appointment to be fingerprinted.

(b) Maintain a copy of the completed and signed form or forms for each individual entered into the child care background check system under the license.

(c) Provide to the department, upon request, a copy of the individual's completed and signed form or forms.

(d) Establish and activate an account and accurately enroll each individual listed in subrule (1) of this rule in the child care background check system.

(e) Within the department's child care background check system, accurately complete and maintain the connection, disconnection, or withdrawn status of each individual associated with the license.

(f) Immediately disconnect each individual from the system once he or she is no longer a licensee, licensee designee, child care staff member, child care aide, or an unsupervised volunteer under the license.

Ms. Stout failed to maintain a copy of the completed and signed form or forms for each individual entered into the child care background check system under the, provide to the department, upon request, a copy of the individual's completed and signed form or forms license for child care staff member Shelby Jessup.

R 400.8125

Staff; volunteer; requirements.

(1) All staff and volunteers shall provide appropriate care and supervision of children at all times.

Ms. Stout failed to provide appropriate care and supervision of children at all times, without her knowledge, a child attempted to open the center door when licensing rang the doorbell, there was one child care staff member providing care to 9 children in two different rooms, and a child ate a snack without the child care staff member being aware or washing her hands. The child care staff member appeared to be distracted with the upcoming graduation decorations.

R 400.8131(5) Professional development requirements.

(5) Within 90 days of being hired, or the first day as an unsupervised volunteer, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall complete the following trainings, which may count toward annual professional development hours and are available at MiRegistry:

- (a) Administration of medication.
- (b) Prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions.
- (c) Building and physical premises safety.
- (d) Emergency preparedness and response planning.
- (e) Handling and storage of hazardous materials and appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants.
- (f) Precautions in transporting children, if applicable.
- (g) Child development.

Ms. Stout failed to ensure child care staff member Shelby Jessup completed training on administration of medication, prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions, building and physical premises safety, emergency preparedness and response planning, handling and storage of hazardous materials and appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants, precautions in transporting children, if applicable and child development within 90 days of being hired,

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

(12) When the department of licensing and regulatory affairs or the department of education publishes a notice that a new health and safety update document or a new health and safety update training activity has been published on MiRegistry, the licensee shall ensure that all personnel read and acknowledge the document or complete the activity within 6 month of the notice.

Ms. Stout or child care staff member Shelby Jessup did not read and acknowledge the document or complete the activity within 6 month of the health and safety update training activities when the department of licensing and regulatory affairs or the department of education published it in 2022.

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

- (6) All child care staff members who work directly with children shall complete 16 clock hours of professional development annually on topics relevant to job responsibilities that include, but are not limited to, any of the following subjects:
- (a) Child development and learning.
 - (b) Health, safety, and nutrition.
 - (c) Family and community collaboration.
 - (d) Program management.
 - (e) Teaching and learning.
 - (f) Observation, documentation, and assessment.
 - (g) Interactions and guidance.
 - (h) Child care center administrative rules.

Ms. Stout failed to complete 16 clock hours of professional development annually on topics relevant to job responsibilities.

R 400.8131(3) Professional development requirements.

- (3) Before caring for children, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall be trained on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect.

Ms. Stout failed to ensure child care staff member Shelby Jessup was trained on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect before caring for children

R 400.8510 Plans and specifications; submission; approval; inspections.

- (5) Fuel-fired furnaces shall be inspected by a licensed mechanical contractor before issuance of an original license and every 2 years at renewal.

Ms. Stout failed to have the fueled-fired furnaces inspected by a licensed mechanical contractor before issuance of an original license and every 2 years at renewal.

R 400.8510 Plans and specifications; submission; approval; inspections.

(6) Fuel-fired water heaters shall be inspected by a licensed mechanical contractor or a licensed plumbing contractor before issuance of an original license and every 2 years at renewal.

Ms. Stout failed to have the Fuel-fired water heaters inspected by a licensed mechanical contractor before issuance of an original license and every 2 years at renewal.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, receipt of a fire inspection, receipt of a fueled fired furnace and water heater inspection, I recommend renewal of this child care center license.
