

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center’s records, including staff records and children’s records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children’s records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During the onsite renewal inspection, I observed rest time, large group literacy activities, choice time, bodily care routines, snack, transitions, and gym activities. Staff members provided children with developmentally appropriate activities and used positive guidance techniques throughout the inspection period.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.8152 Medication; administrative procedures.

(4) Prescription medication must have the pharmacy label indicating the physician's name, child's first and last name, instructions, name, and strength of the medication, and must be given according to those instructions.

One child's prescription medication (epi-pen) did not have the pharmacy label indicating the physician's name, child's first and last name, instructions, name, and strength of the medication.

R 400.8152 Medication; administrative procedures.

(5) A child care staff member shall keep all medication out of the reach of children and shall return it to the child's parent or destroy it when the parent determines it is no longer needed or it has expired.

Child care staff members did not return expired medication to a child's parent. One child's epi-pen expired in October of 2021. No other epi-pen was available for the child.

R 400.8335 Food services and nutrition; provided by center.

(8) All of the following apply to milk:
(b) Milk must be served within 7 days of opening.

Child care staff members did not ensure milk was served within 7 days of opening. One open container of milk in the infant room was dated 03/07/2022, which was 9 days after opening.

R 400.8340 Food services and nutrition; provided by parents.

(3) Breast milk, formula, milk, other beverages, and food furnished in a same-day supply must be covered and labeled with the child's first and last name and the date.

Staff did not ensure that milk provided by parents was labeled with the child's first and last name and the date. One toddler's bottle was not labeled with his/her name and date.

R 400.8530

Hazard Areas.

(4) Heating shall be by a central heating plant or an approved permanently installed electrical heating system. If heating is provided by a central heating plant and located on the same floor that is used for child occupancy, it shall be installed in an enclosure providing not less than a 1-hour fire-resistive separation, including a minimum of 45-minute rated fire door and frame assembly equipped with an approved self-closing device and positive latching hardware in any interior door opening. Door openings for heat plant enclosures not located on the same floor that is used for child occupancy may have 1 3/4-inch flush solid wood core doors or 20-minute labeled fire-rated doors having positive latching hardware and an approved self-closing device. Air for proper combustion, a minimum of 1 square inch per 4,000 BTUs input, shall be provided directly from the outside through a permanently opened louver or metal duct. "B" labeled doors are acceptable.

Doors to heat plant rooms did not meet the rule for fire separation. New doors have been ordered and must be installed in order to comply with fire safety rules. The center currently had a "C" fire rating until compliance is maintained.


Technical Assistance was provided on the following:

- Contacting the QFI once all fire safety issues have been addressed in order to obtain an "A" fire rating. A copy of the "A" rating report must be sent to child care licensing.

A corrective action plan was requested and approved on 03/16/2022. It is expected that the corrective action plan be implemented within the specified time frames as outlined in the approved plan. A follow-up evaluation may be made to verify compliance. Should the corrections not be implemented in the specified time, it may be necessary to reevaluate the status of your license.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care center.
