### Findings of the Inspection

The purpose of the Interim inspection was to determine compliance with applicable licensing statutes and administrative rules for child care Center.

During the on-site inspection Jessica Miranda-Bevier observed free play, outdoor play, lunch, rest time, and diapering in the toddler room. Child care staff members interacted with children in a positive and nurturing manner. Staff were providing appropriate care and supervision. Staff used problem solving and reminders as positive discipline strategies. Center, staff, and child files were organized and made readily available.

During the Interim inspection, licensing consultant Jessica Miranda-Bevier found 1 violation. The violations are listed and explained below. Due to the violations, the licensee/licensee designee must send the bureau a [corrective action plan](#) by 7/15/2024. The corrective action plan may be submitted in the [Child Care Hub Information Record Portal \(CCHIRP\)](#). The corrective action plan must include the following:

- How compliance with each rule will be achieved.
- Who is directly responsible for implementing the corrective action for each violation.
- Specific time frames for each violation as to when the correction will be completed or implemented.
- How continuing compliance will be maintained once compliance is achieved.
- The signature of the responsible party and a date.

R 400.8125(5)(c)	The individual knows that all staff and volunteers are required by law to immediately report suspected abuse and neglect to children's protective services.
722.115n(3)	Each individual listed in subsection (1) shall give written consent at the time of the license application and before a group child care home or family child care home allows an individual to be a member of the household, or before becoming a child care staff member to allow the department of state police to conduct the criminal history check required under subsection (1). The department shall require the individual to submit his or her fingerprints to the department of state police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the criminal history check as required in subsection (1).
R 400.8125(5)	A written statement must be signed and dated by staff and volunteers at the time of hiring or before volunteering indicating all of the following information: child abuse and neglect
R 400.8125(5)(a)	The individual is aware that abuse and neglect of children is against the law.

R 400.8125(5)(c)	The individual knows that all staff and volunteers are required by law to immediately report suspected abuse and neglect to children's protective services
R 400.8182(3)(a)	Infants and toddlers, birth until 30 months of age, child care staff member to child ratio of 1 to 4, maximum group size of 12.
R 400.8380(4)	Floors, interior walls, and ceilings must be kept in sound condition, good repair, and maintained in a clean condition.
R 400.8170(8)	The outdoor play area must be protected from hazards, when necessary, by a fence or natural barrier that is at least 48 inches in height.

Bureau Recommendation
Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend the no change in the status of the license.
