Approved Child Use Space:

LISD Young Children's Services at Trenton Hills is located inside Trenton Hills which is a building owned by the Lenawee Intermediate School District. The school district provides special educational programming and educational services for children of all ages from birth through 26 years old in another area of the building. As such, the building is considered a school through the Lenawee Intermediate School District. The center utilizes three room as approved child use space; Room 20/50 (Inclusion/tuition based preschool), Room 100 (inclusive/tuition based GSRP), room 130 (large motor room).

The center provides full time preschool programming from 8:30 am until 3:15 pm through the school year only. Before and after care is also available from 7:15 am until 8:30 am and from 3:15 pm until 5:30 pm. Through the school year. Transportation services will be provided by the parents and Lenawee Intermediate School District. The tuition-based children will be transported by their parents. The special education children will be transported by Lenawee Intermediate School District. The parents can provide meals and snacks for the children. Children who qualify for free or reduced meals can have their breakfast, lunch, and snacks provided for them from a centralized kitchen operated by Adrian Public School District. The snacks provided for the children will consist of prepackaged and fresh food items.

During my onsite inspection on 4/4/23, I observed the children during small and large group activities, reading instruction time, and freedom of choice activities. All of the

rooms were equipped with an adequate amount of age-appropriate play and learning equipment conducive to a preschool and before/after school care setting. The center provides the children with daily various activities that include circle time, name and letter recognition, counting activities, music and reading instruction, and various arts and craft activities. Caregiver interactions with children were positive and nurturing.

Approved Program Director: Ms. Elizabeth Phelan is the approved program director under licensing rule R400.5103(3)(b) and (4) since 4/6/2011.

Approved Central Administrator: None.

Approved Variances: A variance was granted to licensing rule R400.8173(10) Equipment on 9/22/2020. The center is accommodating children with Individualized Education Plans. Some of the plans state as a part of their goals is to meet the children's needs for gross motor development opportunities. These goals are written by professional staff such as occupational therapists within the school district and have included the need for specific equipment to be used, such as a trampoline, to meet the children's individual needs for daily movement. The trampolines used would consist of the smaller type with support hand railings that would be used by one child at a time. The licensing rule expressly specifies that trampolines shall not be used by children in care. The center will store and use the trampoline in a dedicated therapy space only. The trampoline will only be used by children whose Individualized Education Plan indicates this particular motor activity. The children will be closely supervised by caregiving staff while they use the small trampoline.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children's records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

The facility is in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend no change in the current license status.
