On 9/21/22, child care staff members, Ms. Emily Swander, Ms. Ivy McDonald, and Ms. Ashley McCutchan did not provide Child A with appropriate care and supervision when they momentarily left Child A alone in the fenced outdoor play area for approximately one to two minutes timeframe.	I, Ms. Karah Reosler, licensee designee was found in non compliance of this licensing rule. I will assure the child care staff members provide the children with appropriate care and supervision at all times. On 9/21/22, Child A did not receive appropriate care and supervision. On 9/21/22, Child A was momentarily left alone on the playground for a couple minutes before he was returned back to his classroom. He was	12/06/2022

		<p>found sitting in a wagon located inside the fenced play area. Child A was not harmed and remains in care at the center. Since the incident, I have spoken with all of the staff members to remind them of the importance of assuring the children are provided with appropriate care and supervision at all times. We have discussed the importance of conducting random head counts at all times of the day to include during busy transition times. In addition, we also discussed the importance of positioning staff at the front and rear of the walking lines when transporting children. We reminded staff of the importance to assure they know what activities children are always engaged in, to include in outdoor play and positioning themselves where they are able to observe optimum view of the children at all times. Since the incident occurred, staff have also added additional times when they complete head counts of the children when transitioning back inside from the playground to not only include when leaving the playground, but also after they exit the gated area to assure no child was left behind. In addition, the staff members know during transition times to keep the children who struggle with transition times within close proximity of the staff during transition times. This violation has been corrected and will be maintained at all times.</p>
