Dear Mr. Jones:

This letter is a follow-up to the Department's findings regarding the interim inspection conducted at your center on 06/07/2023. The purpose of this inspection was to determine compliance with applicable licensing statutes and administrative rules for Child Care Centers.

The violations that were found are:

**R 400.8112 Comprehensive background check; fingerprinting.**

(1) Pursuant to section 5n of the act, MCL 722.115n, before an individual has unsupervised contact with children, the department shall determine the individual's eligibility to be any of the following:

(c) A child care staff member.

A child care staff member was working with children and had not completed the comprehensive background check to determine eligibility.

**R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.**

(12) When the department of licensing and regulatory affairs or the department of education publishes a notice that a new health and safety update document or a new health and safety update training activity has been published on MiRegistry, the licensee shall ensure that all personnel read and acknowledge

the document or complete the activity within 6 months of the notice.

The program director did not complete the Health and Safety refresher trainings for 2021 and 2022.

**R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.**

(3) Before caring for children, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall be trained on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect.

Four child care staff members had not completed training on the prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect.

**R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.**

(5) Within 90 days of being hired, or the first day as an unsupervised volunteer, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall complete the following trainings, which may count toward annual professional development hours and are available at MiRegistry:

- (a) Administration of medication.
- (b) Prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions.
- (c) Building and physical premises safety.
- (d) Emergency preparedness and response planning.
- (e) Handling and storage of hazardous materials and appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants.
- (f) Precautions in transporting children, if applicable.
- (g) Child development.

Four child care staff members did not complete training Health and Safety 2 which included subsections (c) through (g).

**R 400.8167 Indoor space.**

(1) The required square footage of indoor space per child must be at least the following:

- (b) Thirty-five square feet for preschoolers and school-agers.

The school age room was converted to church use space and was no longer set up for children in care. The children's equipment and furnishings were no longer present. The licensee designee was informed that the room would be removed as approved child use space.

**R 400.8530 Hazard Areas.**

(9) The center shall not store flammable materials, including fuels, pressurized cans, cleaning fluids and supplies, polishes, and matches, in heat plant enclosures. These items may be stored outside of child use areas in metal cabinets or storage facilities accessible only to authorized personnel.

The furnace room had cleaning supplies and was being used for storage for excess equipment.

Due to the violations, you must send us a corrective action plan by 7/15/2023. You can use our [corrective action plan](#) form or create your own.

If you need help writing the corrective action plan, please contact me. If you do not send a corrective action plan, you may face disciplinary action. The corrective action plan must include the following:

- How compliance with each rule will be achieved.
- Who is directly responsible for implementing the corrective action for each violation.
- Specific time frames for each violation as to when the correction will be completed or implemented.
- How continuing compliance will be maintained once compliance is achieved.
- The signature of the responsible party and a date.

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, there will be no change to your license status.

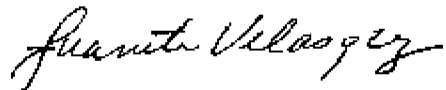
