Dear Mrs. Reissig:

This letter is a follow-up to the Department's findings regarding the interim inspection conducted at your center on 10/26/2022. The purpose of this inspection was to determine compliance with applicable licensing statutes and administrative rules for Child Care Centers.

As a result of the inspection, I did not find any rule or law violations.

The center does not provide food service, swimming, or transportation. During the on-site inspection I observed the children engaged in quiet time activities. I also observe a child engaged in freedom of choice learning. I provided a basic rule review regarding infant safe sleep.

I provided technical assistance regarding the center's outdoor play space. The center uses infant swings and other low to the ground playground equipment. The technical assistance included that all pieces of playground equipment that have an elevated playing or climbing surface, regardless of height of the playing or climbing surface, must be surrounded by shock absorbing surface and meet the guidelines defined by the Consumer Product Safety Commission Handbook for Public Playground Safety. The shock absorbing surface material may be either unitary or the loose-fill type. During the on-site inspection, the licensee was using unitary mats under the infant swing and small step-up low equipment. Ms. Reissig would prefer to use unitary mats due to the children's young ages. The mats being used did not appear to be commercial ground cover. I referred Ms. Reissig to research commercial playground surfacing websites such as playgroundsurfacing.com regarding unitary mats, as well as suggested that she contact a certified playground inspector for additional guidance. Ms. Reissig agreed to not allow

the children to use any elevated play surfaces until adequate commercial unitary mats or other approved ground cover is in place. The playground large enough to provided non-elevated play areas for the children.


