III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center’s records, including staff records and children’s records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children’s records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During the on-site inspection, I observed children in care engaged in a variety of developmentally appropriate activities, including free play with Magna Tiles, train set, dramatic play, painting, and outdoor play. I observed large group time which included a Hebrew lesson. I also observed toileting, handwashing, and children eating lunch. The child care staff members’ interactions with the children were

positive and nurturing. They were engaged with the children while being attentive to their needs.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.8128 Staff; volunteer; tuberculosis.

A center shall keep on file at the center evidence to verify that each child care staff member and each volunteer who has contact with children at least 4 hours per week for more than 2 consecutive weeks is free from communicable tuberculosis (TB). Verification of TB status is required within 1 year before employment or volunteering.

Three of the five child care staff members did not have verification of TB status within 1 year before employment.

- Child care staff member (E.F.) was hired in August 2022 and her verification of TB status was dated 04/12/2016.
- Child care staff member (J.W.) was hired in August 2022 and her verification of TB status was dated 09/08/2020.
- Child care staff member (S.G.) was hired in August 2022 and she did not have verification of TB status.

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

(3) Before caring for children, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall be trained on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect.

Two of the five child care staff members were not trained on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect before caring for children.

Child care staff members (J.W.) and (S.G.) were hired in August 2022 and they have not completed the training.

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

(4) Before unsupervised contact with children, all child care staff members who work directly with children shall complete prevention and control of infectious disease training, including immunizations.

Two of the five child care staff members did not complete prevention and control of infectious disease training, including immunizations, before having unsupervised contact with children.

Child care staff members (J.W.) and (S.G.) were hired in August 2022 and they have not completed the training.

R 400.8146 Information provided to parents.

(3) For infants and toddlers, a center shall provide parents with a written daily record that includes at least the following information:

- (a) Food intake time, type of food, and amount eaten.
- (b) Sleeping patterns indicating when and how long the child slept.
- (c) Elimination patterns, including bowel movements, consistency, and frequency.
- (d) Developmental milestones.
- (e) Changes in the child's usual behaviors.

Three toddler room classrooms do not provide written daily records to each parent. The center provides daily general classroom information to parents.

R 400.8152 Medication; administrative procedures.

(3) All medication must be in its original container, stored according to instructions, and clearly labeled for a named child, including all nonprescription topical medications described in subrule (8) of this rule.

In Room 18, one child's Zyrtec and one child's Benadryl were not labeled with the children's names.

In Room 35, one child's Benadryl was not labeled with the child's name.

R 400.8152 Medication; administrative procedures.

(4) Prescription medication must have the pharmacy label indicating the physician's name, child's first and last name, instructions, name and strength of the medication, and must be given according to those instructions.

In Room 18, one child's Auvi-Q and one child's Kaleo was not in its original container with the pharmacy label indicating the physician's name, child's first and last name, instructions, name, and strength of the medication.

R 400.8152 Medication; administrative procedures.

(5) A child care staff member shall keep all medication out of the reach of children and shall return it to the child's parent or destroy it when the parent determines it is no longer needed or it has expired.

In Room 18, one child's Kaleo expired on 11/07/2021 and one child's Auvi-Q expired on 07/01/2020 and Benadryl expired in 10/2021.

R 400.8170 Outdoor play area.

(11) The playground equipment, use zones, and surfacing in the outdoor play area must be inspected by a certified playground safety inspector and an approval granted for playground equipment and areas used before issuance of an original license, upon request of the department, and before using any newly added playground equipment. The center shall provide documentation of the inspection to the department upon request and shall keep it on file at the center.

I observed children in Room 17 playing on newly installed playground equipment on the side playground area during the renewal inspection without it being inspected by a certified playground safety inspector and being approved by the department.

R 400.8520 Interior finishes.

(14) Combustible materials and decorations may be displayed on walls, not to exceed 20% of each wall in each room. Combustible materials and decorations suspended from or near the ceiling are prohibited.

In Room 2, children's artwork was suspended near the ceiling.

Technical Assistance and Consultation were provided for the following:

- R 400.8112 (2) (e) Comprehensive background check; fingerprinting. We discussed the connection and disconnection process for the Child Care Background Check system.
- R 400.8113 (3) (c) Program director qualifications; responsibilities. We discussed updating the staff handbook to state that annual evaluations instead of bi-annual evaluations are completed.

- R 400.8125 (1) Staff; volunteer; requirements. We discussed better ways to provide supervision of children when they play on the Bridge.
- R 400.8125 (4) Staff; volunteer; requirements. Update the center's staff and volunteer screening and supervision policy to include a statement that any individual registered on the public sex offender registry (PSOR) is prohibited from having contact with any child in care.
- R 400.8131 (11) Professional development requirements. We discussed the documentation required to verify completion of training.
- R 400.8137 (1) (e) and (7) Diapering; toileting. We discussed acceptable areas to diaper children.
- R 400.8143 (11) Children's records. We discussed acceptable ways to record attendance.
- R 400.8146 (1) (I) (i-iii) Information provided to parents. Update parent handbook to include correct years listed in the rule for retention of reports and bold print child care licensing's website.
- R 400.8161 (7) Emergency procedures. We discussed acceptable ways to document fire and tornado drills.
- R 400.8340 (3) Food services and nutrition; provided by parents. We discussed water bottles must be labeled with first and last names.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care center.
