**III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS**

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center’s records, including staff records and children’s records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children’s records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

**R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.**

**(3) Before caring for children, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall be trained on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect.**

Two new child care staff members have been working with children but have not yet received training on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect.

**R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.**

**(6) All child care staff members who work directly with children shall complete 16 clock hours of professional development annually on topics relevant to job responsibilities that include, but are not limited to, any of the following subjects:**

- (a) Child development and learning.**
- (b) Health, safety, and nutrition.**
- (c) Family and community collaboration.**
- (d) Program management.**
- (e) Teaching and learning.**
- (f) Observation, documentation, and assessment.**
- (g) Interactions and guidance.**
- (h) Child care center administrative rules.**

Several child care staff members did not have 16 hours of professional development for 2021.

**R 400.8134 Hand washing.**

**(2) All staff and volunteers shall wash their hands at all of the following times:**

- (e) After each diapering.**

In the toddler room, the child care staff member did not wash their hands between the diapering of three children. They did wash their hands once, after all of the children had been changed.

**R 400.8134            Hand washing.**

- (3) Staff and volunteers shall ensure that children wash their hands at all of the following times:
  - (b) After toileting or diapering.

In the toddler room, the child care staff member did not ensure that three children washed their hands after diapering.

**R 400.8152            Medication; administrative procedures.**

- (5) A child care staff member shall keep all medication out of the reach of children and shall return it to the child's parent or destroy it when the parent determines it is no longer needed or it has expired.

In the toddler room, two medications were being stored for named children, which were expired.

**R 400.8185            Primary care.**

- (5) Primary caregiving assignments must be documented and provided to parents.

In the infant room, the posted primary caregiving assignments were not up to date.

**IV. RECOMMENDATION**

Upon the receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend no change to the status of this license.
