

ALLEGATION: On 8/13/2024, Child A (23 months, female) is allergic to eggs and was served eggs for lunch. She had an allergic reaction.

INVESTIGATION:

On 8/16/2024, I interviewed Child A's Mother. On 8/13/24, she picked up Child A at child care. She observed that they were having tuna fish with egg in it. She questioned Child care staff member (CCSM)1 if Child A ate dinner as she is allergic to eggs. CCSM1 told her that Child A did not eat the tuna fish because she was aware Child A had an allergy to eggs. She asked if she had the meal for lunch as it was offered at lunch time. CCSM1 stated that she did not know as she was not caring for Child A at that time. Child A had a reaction later in the evening and she gave her Benadryl to assist the reaction. In the morning the reaction was worse, so she took Child A to be seen at the doctor. The program director called her and told her that it appeared that Child A was fed eggs for lunch yesterday. She had a meeting with the program director and Nicole Wiggins, licensee that afternoon to discuss the situation.

On 8/19/24, I made an onsite visit to the center. I interviewed the program director. She was aware of Child A getting served eggs for lunch even though she is allergic to them. She is not sure why Child A was fed eggs. It is documented that she has an egg allergy. She was notified by text on the evening of 8/13/24 by CCSM1 that Child A may have had eggs for lunch even though she is allergic to them. She talked to CCSM2 the following day and found out that CCSM2 did feed Child A eggs and stated that she was not aware that Child A is allergic to eggs. The program director contacted Child A's Mother in the afternoon when she had time and found out that Child A received treatment for her allergic reaction to the eggs. She and Nicole Liggins, licensee, met with Child A's Mother that afternoon.

I observed Child A's child information card and physical. They both noted that she has an egg and grass allergy. It is also posted in the kitchen.

I interviewed CCSM1. Child A was in her room for dinner time. She double checks on what children have allergies when she serves food. She checked and noticed three children had allergies to the dinner that was provided so she provided them something different to eat. Child A's Mother came to pick up Child A and observed that there were
