

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center’s records, including staff records and children’s records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children’s records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations. All records were in compliance.


During the onsite inspection I observed four classrooms. The infants were engaging in tummy time and sitting in their bouncy seats. The primary caregiver system is in place and the parents receive daily records of the infant’s daily movements. The toddlers were engaging in outdoor play. The preschoolers were reading the “M”

book. The summer camp children were engaging in a science lesson. They reflected on their walk to the park. They collected walnuts, rocks, acorns, and helicopter leaves. They were preparing to view the items through a 3D lens. The child care staff member showed the children how to identify an unknown object on Google. The children ate chicken nuggets, green beans, peaches, bread, and milk.

The facility is in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care facility.
