
The facility is in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes.

On 04/19/2022, I completed an on-site inspection at Children’s Place Montessori of Brownstone. I observed the caregivers interact appropriately with the children. In each classroom the children were engaged in different activities (i.e. circle time

which included reading a story to the children, working with letters, puzzles and coloring. The children played outside and ate lunch during the inspection. The center is equipped with a variety of developmentally appropriate equipment.
