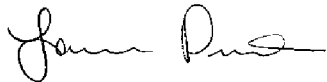

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center’s records, including staff records and children’s records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children’s records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.8112 Comprehensive background check; fingerprinting.

(2) An applicant or licensee shall do all of the following:

(b) Maintain a copy of the completed and signed form or forms for each individual entered into the child care background check system under the license.

On 05/04/2023, There are four volunteers listed on the child care background check system. Only two had consent and disclosure forms on file.

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

(3) Before caring for children, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall be trained on prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect.

On 05/04/2023, Two child care staff members were missing trainings in the prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment, and recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect. These trainings are included in the MiRegistry Health and Safety Course 2.

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

(4) Before unsupervised contact with children, all child care staff members who work directly with children shall complete prevention and control of infectious disease training, including immunizations.

On 05/04/2023, Two child care staff members were missing trainings in the prevention and control of infectious disease training, including immunizations. This training is included in the MiRegistry Healthy and Safety Course 1.

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

(5) Within 90 days of being hired, or the first day as an unsupervised volunteer, all child care staff members and unsupervised volunteers who work directly with children shall complete the following trainings, which may count toward annual professional development hours and are available at MiRegistry:

(a) Administration of medication.

(b) Prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions.

- (c) Building and physical premises safety.
- (d) Emergency preparedness and response planning.
- (e) Handling and storage of hazardous materials and appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants.
- (f) Precautions in transporting children, if applicable.
- (g) Child development.

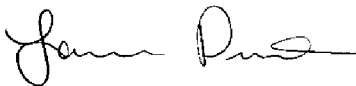
On 05/04/2023, one child care staff member was missing proof of completion of training in Administration of medication, prevention of and response to emergencies due to food ad allergic reactions, building and physical premises safety, emergency preparedness and response planning, handling, and storing of hazardous materials and appropriate disposal of bio contaminates, precautions in transporting children, and child development. All these trainings are covered in the health and safety training course one and two. One child care staff member was still within her 90 window to complete these trainings.

On 05/04/2023, during an onsite inspection, I observed children arriving to the program. Upon arrival, children washed their hands for snack. During snack time children and staff engaged in conversations about their school day as well as talking about being excited for summer. After snack, children had some free time where students were able to use computers to play different educational games.

A corrective action plan was requested and approved on 05/05/2023. It is expected that the corrective action plan be implemented within the specified time frames as outlined in the approved plan. A follow-up evaluation may be made to verify compliance. Should the corrections not be implemented in the specified time, it may be necessary to reevaluate the status of your license.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care center.
