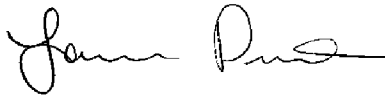

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children's records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.8112 Comprehensive background check; fingerprinting.

- (2) An applicant or licensee shall do all of the following:**
(b) Maintain a copy of the completed and signed form or forms for each individual entered into the child care background check system under the license.

On 05/24/2023, there were no consent and disclosure forms on file at the center for two unsupervised volunteers connected to the facility on the child care background check system.

R 400.8112 Comprehensive background check; fingerprinting.

- (2) An applicant or licensee shall do all of the following:**
(e) Within the department's child care background check system, accurately complete and maintain the connection, disconnection, or withdrawn status of each individual associated with the license.

On 05/24/2023, there are two employees connected to the child care background check system who no longer work on site. There is also one child care staff member that is working at the facility but is not connected to the Child care background check system.

R 400.8131 Professional development requirements.

- (12) When the department of licensing and regulatory affairs or the department of education publishes a notice that a new health and safety update document or a new health and safety update training activity has been published on MiRegistry, the licensee shall ensure that all personnel read and acknowledge the document or complete the activity within 6 month of the notice.**

On 05/24/2023, One child care staff member was missing the 2020 health and safety refresher course.

A corrective action plan was requested and approved on 05/25/2023. It is expected that the corrective action plan be implemented within the specified time frames as outlined in the approved plan. A follow-up evaluation may be made to verify compliance. Should the corrections not be implemented in the specified time, it may be necessary to reevaluate the status of your license.

On 05/24/2023, I observed children arriving to the program. Upon arrival children grabbed a snack and sat down. After snack children were able to choose what activity they wanted to do at day. Some children chose to paint nails and make t-shirts while other chose to play video games or play with legos. All staff interacted appropriately with all children present.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care facility.
