**III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS**

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center’s records, including staff records and children’s records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children’s records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

**R 400.8128                    Staff; volunteer; tuberculosis.**

A center shall keep on file at the center evidence to verify that each child care staff member and each volunteer who has contact with children at least 4 hours per week for more than 2 consecutive weeks is free from communicable tuberculosis (TB). Verification of TB status is required within 1 year before employment or volunteering.

Five of the 16 staff records reviewed did not have documentation of a negative TB on file at the child care center.

**R 400.8137                    Diapering; toileting.**

(1) Except as provided in subrule (2) of this rule, diapering must occur in a designated diapering area that complies with all of the following:

(c) Has non-absorbent, smooth, easily cleanable surface in good repair.

In the infant room, the diaper changing pad was not easily cleanable and in good repair. The changing pad had several tears causing it to be absorbent.

**R 400.8137                    Diapering; toileting.**

(7) Guidelines for diapering must be posted in diapering areas.

The guidelines for changing diapers were not posted in the infant room near the diapering area.

**R 400.8143                    Children's records.**

(1) At the time of a child's initial attendance, a center shall obtain a child information card, using a form provided by the department or a comparable substitute, that is completed and signed by the child's parent. The center shall keep it on file and accessible in the center.

Eight of the ten child information cards reviewed were incomplete. They were missing the following information: physician's name, phone number, parent's employer name, work phone number, parent's signature and date of signed.

**R 400.8143 Children's records.**

(3) For children under school-age, at the time of a child's initial attendance, a center shall obtain, keep on file, and make accessible in the center 1 of the following:

(a) A certificate of immunization showing a minimum of 1 dose of each immunizing agent specified by the department of health and human services (DHHS).

Three of the ten children records reviewed did not have immunizations on file at the center.

**R 400.8143 Children's records.**

(6) Within 30 days of a child's initial attendance, a center shall obtain, keep on file, and make accessible in the center a record of a physical evaluation of the child that notes any restrictions and is signed by a physician or the physician's designee. An electronic record from a physician's office will be accepted. The physical evaluation must be performed within 1 of the following time limits:

(b) For toddlers, within the preceding 6 months.

Two of the ten children records reviewed did not have physicals on file at the center.

**R 400.8182 Ratio and group size requirements.**

(3) In each room or well-defined space, the maximum group size and ratio of child care staff members to children, including children related to a staff member or the licensee, must be as shown in Table 4:

Age Maximum Group Size	Child Care Staff member to Child Ratio
a) Infants and toddlers, 12 birth until 30 months of age	1 to 4

On 05/18/2022, the toddler room was out of ratio. There were 14 toddlers present with two child care staff members.

**R 400.8335 Food services and nutrition; provided by center.**

- (8) All of the following apply to milk:
  - (a) Containers must be labeled with the date opened..

In the kitchen, there was a gallon of milk that was not labeled with the date opened. In the infant room, there were two containers of Silk milk that was not labeled with the date opened.

**R 400.8340 Food services and nutrition; provided by parents.**


- (3) Breast milk, formula, milk, other beverages, and food furnished in a same-day supply must be covered and labeled with the child's first and last name and the date.

In the infant room refrigerator, there were five bottles that were not labeled with the child's first and last name and date. In the kitchen refrigerator, there was one bottle that was not labeled with the required information.

On 05/18/2022, I completed an on-site inspection at Early Start Childcare. I observed the caregivers interact appropriately with the children. The children participated in educational activities, ate lunch and laid down for nap during the inspection. The center is equipped with a variety of developmentally appropriate equipment. Consultation was provided regarding licensing forms and required health and safety training through miregistry.

**IV. RECOMMENDATION**

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend the issuance of a regular license to this child care facility.
