Approved child use space: : The main level has a living room, kitchen, and two bedrooms approved for child use space. The basement has a living room and bedroom approved for child use space.

Exiting information (including second floor and basement): The main level has a front door and back door that can be used for emergency escape. The basement has a staircase leading to the back door that can be used for emergency escape. Ms. Nelson's second exit from the basement is a remote window that was approved prior to the January 2006 rule change requiring that basement escape windows meet specific size guidelines; therefore, her basement escape window is not required to meet these dimensions. She has installed steps with a platform and handrail.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

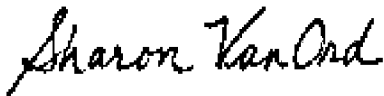
When I arrived Ms. Nelson was providing care to three unrelated children. Ms. Nelson was assisting children with sunblock and swim suits as they were preparing to go outside for water play.

Ms. Nelson is relaxed and nurturing with the children in care. She uses appropriate language skills with children; redirecting children when needed. She has a sufficient amount of equipment for the children to choose from and has it well organized. Ms. Nelson maintains required paperwork in an organized manner.

The facility is in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care family home (capacity 1-6).
