Approved child use space: The living room, the dining room, the kitchen, the play room, and the master bedroom are approved as child use space.

Exiting information (including second floor and basement): There are three exits in the home. The front entrance provides safe egress to the front yard adjacent to the drive way. The second exit is through the utility/laundry room which leads into the garage which then exits to the driveway in the front yard. The third exit is located in the dining room. There is a sliding glass door which exits out to a porch within the fenced in outdoor play area. Since the porch has three steps with no railing, this exit can only be used during emergencies until a handrail is installed and approved.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

The facility is in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R400.1918(3) Medication; administration; procedures.

(3) All medication must be in the original container, stored according to instructions, and clearly labeled for a named child.

A child in care had a prescription inhaler in his backpack. It was not clearly labeled with the child's name.

R400.1918(4) Medication; administration; procedures.

(4) Prescription medication must have the pharmacy label indicating the physician's name, child's first and last name, instructions, and name and strength of the medication, and must be given in accordance with those instructions.

A child had a prescription inhaler in his backpack. The inhaler did not have the pharmacy label indicating the physician's name, child's first and last name, instructions, and name and strength of the medication.

R400.1918(6) Medication; administration; procedures.

(6) A licensee or child care staff member shall give or apply prescription or nonprescription medication according to the directions on the original container unless otherwise authorized by a written order of the child's physician.

Ms. Osier administered Tylenol to a child under the age of two. The directions say the medication is not to be administered to children under two years of age. A physician's note was not on file.

R400.1924(2)(b) Hand washing.

(2) Personnel shall ensure that children wash their hands at all of the following times:

(b) After toileting or diapering.

Ms. Osier did not wash a child's hands after changing a diaper.

R400.1945(4)

Emergency; plan; drill.

(4) Fire drills must be practiced while children are in care at least once quarterly, and a written record that includes the date and time it takes to evacuate must be maintained.

Ms. Osier did not conduct a fire drill during every quarter in 2022.

Technical assistance was provided in the following areas:

- It was discussed with Ms. Osier That her ground cover may need refreshing as grass is growing through existing cover.
- Ms. Osier was provided updated child in care statements
- Ms. Osier was provided updated child information cards
- R400.1923(2)(e) was discussed

A corrective action plan was requested and approved on 10/31/2022. It is expected that the corrective action plan be implemented within the specified time frames as outlined in the approved plan. A follow-up evaluation may be made to verify compliance. Should the corrections not be implemented in the specified time, it may be necessary to reevaluate the status of your license.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend renewal of this license.
