Dear Ms. Olawale:

This letter is a follow-up to the Department's findings regarding the interim inspection conducted at your home on 6/07/2022. The purpose of this inspection was to determine compliance with applicable licensing statutes and administrative rules for Family and Group Child Care Homes.

The violations that were found are:

R 400.1920 Outdoor play area and equipment.

- (3) A licensee shall provide an adequate and varied supply of outdoor play equipment, materials, and furniture, that is all of the following:
- (c) Safe and in good repair.

There were a few broken toys that need to be removed from the outdoor play area: a climber that has cracked plastic on it and a small swing that is broken.

R 400.1932 Home maintenance and safety.

- (1) The structure, premises, and furnishings of a child care home must be in good

repair and maintained in a clean, safe, and comfortable condition.

The front door, which is the main fire exit door, is not opening and closing properly and is getting stuck.

R 400.1945 Emergency; plan; drill.

(4) Fire drills must be practiced while children are in care at least once quarterly, and a written record that includes the date and time it takes to evacuate must be maintained.

The last fire drill logged was on 2/25/22. Quarterly drills are defined in technical assistance as no more than 90 days apart.

CONSULTATION:

The snow finally melted in this part of Michigan in May. The licensee stated that her son will be getting some more wood chips and they will be replenishing them under the swings and at the bottom of the slide soon. Be sure this is completed by the end of June, you can send me a photo after this is done.

It is recommended to make sure the path to the secondary exit is clear in case you ever have to use this door.

To remain in compliance with tornado drills, two are needed from now until the end of November.

Due to the violations, you must send us a corrective action plan by 7/5/2022. You can use our corrective action plan form or create your own.

If you need help writing the corrective action plan, please contact me. If you do not send a corrective action plan, you may face disciplinary action. The corrective action plan must include the following:

- How compliance with each rule will be achieved.
- Who is directly responsible for implementing the corrective action for each violation.
- Specific time frames for each violation as to when the correction will be completed or implemented.

- How continuing compliance will be maintained once compliance is achieved.
- The signature of the responsible party and a date.

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, there will be no change to your license status.
