Exiting information (including second floor and basement): There are two remotely located exits on the upper level of the home; the front door and back slider door that leads to a deck overlooking the backyard of the home.

There are two dogs in the child care home. Pet supplies and equipment are maintained inaccessible to the children.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct

observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

During my on-site inspection there were three children in care. They were playing with toys in the play room. There were also three older related children present. Ms. Hardiman was providing appropriate care and supervision. I heard her use reminders and redirection as positive discipline strategies.

I provided technical assistance and consultation on ensuring that music being listened to and programming or video games watched on the television by older children are age appropriate for the child care children present. I also provided technical assistance on required emergency plan postings, child files, adult household members moving into the home, training requirements, notifying the bureau when needing to change hours of care, Radon test, and maintenance of the Child Care Background Check system.

I have included current copies of the Child Information Record (CCL-3731) and Child in Care Statement/Receipt (CCL-3900) with this report.

During the inspection, the child care home was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.1903(1)(g) Licensee Responsibilities.

(1) A licensee shall be responsible for all of the following provisions:

(g) Report to the department within, 3 business days, any changes in the household composition...

Ms. Hardiman did not report within 3 business days that adult household member, DeShawn Hardiman had moved in. I provided technical assistance on comprehensive background check, documentation, and TB test requirements. I have asked Ms. Hardiman to send documentation to the bureau to verify compliance.

R 400.1905(4)(e) Training.

(4) Within 90 days after receiving a child care license or of being hired at a child care home, a licensee, a child care staff member, and a child care assistant shall complete training on all of the following topics:

(e) Precautions in transporting children.

Ms. Hardiman has not completed training on precautions in transporting children. This training is included in Course 2 of the Health and Safety Trainings that is found on MiRegistry.

R 400.1905(4) Training.

(4) Within 90 days after receiving a child care license or of being hired at a child care home, a licensee, a child care staff member, and a child care assistant shall complete training on all of the following topics:

(f) Building and physical premises safety.

Ms. Hardiman has not completed training on building and physical premises safety. This training is included in Course 2 of the Health and Safety Trainings that is found on MiRegistry.

R 400.1905(7) Training.

(7) CPR and first aid training certification must be maintained according to the expiration dates on the individual's certification cards.

Ms. Hardiman did not have current CPR and first aid training on file. She stated that she has registered for a course.

R 400.1922(4) Nighttime care.

(4) If nighttime care is provided, then children shall sleep in age-appropriate cribs and beds. Port-a-cribs and play yards are not allowed for nighttime care.

Ms. Hardiman has been providing nighttime care and children have been sleeping on the couch and nap mat. This is not considered appropriate sleeping equipment for nighttime care. I provided technical assistance that beds, futons, sleeper sofas, and air mattresses are considered appropriate.

R 400.1932(3) Home maintenance and safety.

(3) All steps, stairs, porches, and elevated structures to which children in care have access must be protected to prevent falls, and must be free of ice and snow accumulation.

During my on-site inspection the stairs leading from the upper level of the room did not have a gate to protect against falls.
