R400.1933(4) Water supply; sewage disposal; water temperature.

- The signature of the responsible party and a date.


Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, a regular license will be issued. You will receive it in the mail.

Approved child use space: The kitchen, dining room, living room, family room, and one bedroom on the main level.

One dog and three lizard-type reptiles reside in the child care home. Ms. O'Reilly considers all four pets to be safe around children.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

During the inspection, Ms. O'Reilly engaged in positive interactions with children during indoor play. The children happily played amongst themselves with direction and guidance from Ms. O'Reilly as needed. The child care home was well maintained and organized.

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

During the inspection, the child care home was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.1933 Water supply; sewage disposal; water temperature.

(4) Hot water temperature must not exceed 120 degrees Fahrenheit at water faucets accessible to children.

Ms. O'Reilly did not ensure that the hot water temperature did not exceed 120 degrees at the water faucet accessible to children. The hot water temperature measured 129.7 degrees, which can easily scald a young child.

I provided Ms. O'Reilly with technical assistance for the following:

1907(3) Children's attendance: attendance records must be available upon request. Electronic attendance records are permissible; however, you must be able to present the requested records at the time of the inspection.

1941 Furnace and water heater inspections: inspection reports must indicate that each appliance inspected is in good working order.

1918 Medication: non-prescription medication must be given according to package directions; a physician's note is required if a dosage is not listed for the age of the child.

1907(1)(a) Child information cards: unless otherwise indicated, all requested information must be provided. If the information is not known or does not apply, "unknown" or "none" is the required response. **Note**: a blank field, a line through a field or "N/A" are not acceptable responses.

1945 Emergency plans: emergency plans must indicate how children with chronic medical conditions will be accommodated during an emergency.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care family home (capacity 1-7).
