One cat, seven dogs, eleven birds, fish, one snake, one rabbit, and one lizard reside in the child care home. Ms. Jarema consider all animals to be safe around children.

Ms. Jarema stated that the fireplace is not used when children are in care.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

During the inspection, Ms. Jarema engaged in positive interactions with the children during indoor play. The children played happily amongst themselves. Ms. Jarema provided assistance and guidance as needed.

The facility is in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes.

During the inspection, I provided Ms. Jarema with technical assistance for the following:

1907(1)(a) Child's records: review child information cards to ensure they are fully completed; unless otherwise indicated, all requested information must be provided. If the information is not known or does not apply, "unknown" or "none" is the required response. **Note:** a blank field, a line through a field or "N/A" are not acceptable responses.

1907(1)(b) Child's records: review child in care statements to ensure they are fully completed, including, but not limited to, initialed sections, signatures, and dates.

1945(1) Emergency plans: review emergency plans to ensure compliance with licensing requirements. Sample emergency plans were email to Ms. Jarema on 07/19/2022.

1905(9) Training: when the department of licensing and regulatory affairs or the department of education publishes a notice that a new health and safety update document or a new health and safety update training activity has been published on MiRegistry, the licensee shall ensure that all personnel read and acknowledge the document or complete the activity within 6 months of the notice. The link to the 2021 health and safety refresher course was email to Ms. Jarema on 07/19/2022.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care family home (capacity 1-6).
