Approved child use space: The entire main level of the home, the front far side room on the upper level, and the family room downstairs are approved for child care use space.

Exiting information (including second floor and basement): The front and back doors provide exits on the main level. The stairs leading to the main level and a remotely located exit window provides exits on the upper level. On the basement level a remotely located egress window and the stairs leading to the main level provide exits.

Approved variances -  No  Yes Description: On 9/22/2022 a variance to rule 1910(1) allowing Ms. Teusink to increase her capacity to 7 and to care for children at a 1:7 ratio was granted.

### III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

During the inspection, the child care home was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

**R 400.1914                      Daily activity program.**

(4) Television, video tapes, movies, electronic devices, and computers must be limited to not more than 2 hours per day and to programs designed for children's education, enjoyment, or both. Other activities must be available to children during television and movie viewing.

I arrived for my onsite inspection around 10:15 am. When I arrived, I observed four children in the living room, two laying on mats on the floor and two toddler aged children each sitting in separate pack n' plays. The television was on, and the children were engaged in a television show. I asked Ms. Teusink why the children were laying down at this time and she stated it was quiet/resting time. I informed Ms. Teusink that children cannot just be placed in front of the television and made to watch, that different activities need to be made available to them. Ms. Teusink then gave each child two puzzles and continued to change out the puzzles for the duration of my visit.

#### IV. RECOMMENDATION

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care family home (capacity 1-6).
