III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable childcare home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct

observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

During the on-site inspection, I observed licensee provide direct supervision to children during naptime, children engaged in age-appropriate television, handwashing, snack time and parent pick up. Ms. Troyer's interactions with the children were nurturing, positive and developmentally appropriate. The home was clean and safe for child care use. Required records were organized and readily available for review.

The facility is in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes.
