## III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and

training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

At the time of the onsite inspection, Ms. Kill was present with one child care staff member, eight child care children, and four children over the age of six related to her or her child care staff member. Ms. Kill's staff member was outside with most of the children playing in the outdoor play area while Ms. Kill remained in the home with some younger children and children who wanted to play inside. I observed children washing hands and eating snack. Appropriate care and supervision was provided.

This facility was in compliance with all rules.

During the exit conference, technical assistance/consultation was provided regarding the following:

- I reminded Ms. Kill that her child care assistant must be completely qualified prior to caring for children. This includes health and safety and other trainings, as well as a medical exam and TB test.
- Ms. Kill's last radon test was completed in 2020. Completing a test in 2024 would not be at her renewal, so she is required to complete a new test for this renewal.
- I reminded Ms. Kill that she is not required to maintain a licensing notebook but, if she does, it must not have confidential staff information in it.
- I provided Ms. Kill with examples of alternatives to the word "don't" with regards to discipline. For example, instead of, "don't run," try, "please use walking feet." Instead of, "don't spill your snack," say, "when you spill your snack, I think that you're done." I suggested that Ms. Kill look for trainings with regards to this topic.
- Ms. Kill's pack and play mattresses were not strapped down. She stated that she had just put them back in after cleaning them and that they would be secured to the bases prior to being used for napping.
- I discussed individualized emergency plans for children with chronic medical conditions or special needs.

#### IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care group home (capacity 7-12).
