- R400.1916(13)(a) Bedding and sleeping equipment.**
- R400.1916(14) Bedding and sleeping equipment.**
- R400.1952(1)(b) Child transportation; parent permission; child information card; required when off-premises.**

You gave us an acceptable written corrective action plan. We will send you a regular license in the mail.

Due to the infant safe sleep violation(s), all of your infant caregivers must take training on infant safe sleep. This must be included in your corrective action plan. In addition, a follow up inspection may be made to check compliance with the infant safe sleep rules.



Approved child use space: On the main level of the home the spare bedroom is approved for child use space. The main area on the lower level of the home and the learning room is approved for child use space.

Exiting information (including second floor and basement): The home has three exits on the main level. The front porch off from the living room provides egress to the front of the home. The backdoor provides egress to the backyard and the side door provided egress to the front via the garage; both doors are located in the breezeway off the kitchen. The home has two exits in the basement. There is an egress window located in the learning room that exits to the backyard. There is also a flight of stairs in the basement's main living space that leads to the breezeway and provides egress out the back door and the side door.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

During the on-site inspection there were two child care children that had just arrived at the time of my arrival. Both children were sleeping. One was an infant and was not sleeping in approved sleeping equipment. Ms. Parker was asked to move the infant to an approved sleeping equipment.

During the inspection, the child care home was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.1916 Bedding and sleeping equipment.

(13) None of the following are approved sleeping equipment for children 24 months of age or younger:

- (a) Infant car seats.**
- (b) Infant seats.**
- (c) Infant swings.**
- (d) Bassinets.**
- (e) High chairs.**
- (f) Water beds.**
- (g) Adult beds.**
- (h) Soft mattresses.**
- (i) Sofas.**
- (j) Bean bags.**
- (k) Other soft surfaces.**

An infant was sleeping in an infant care seat upon my arrival.

R 400.1916 Bedding and sleeping equipment.

(14) Children 24 months of age or younger who fall asleep in a space that is not approved for sleeping shall be moved to approved sleeping equipment appropriate for their size and

age.

Ms. Parker did not immediately move the infant to an approved sleeping equipment when the child fell asleep in an infant car seat.

R 400.1952 Child transportation; parent permission; child information card; required when off-premises.

(1) A licensee shall obtain and keep on file written permission from a child's parent before a child is transported in a vehicle. Written permission must be obtained for both of the following:


(b) Nonroutine transportation, before each trip.

Ms. Parker did not ensure that she had written permission from the children's parents for non-routine field trips.

A corrective action plan was requested and approved on 12/20/2022. It is expected that the corrective action plan be implemented within the specified time frames as outlined in the approved plan. A follow-up evaluation may be made to verify compliance. Should the corrections not be implemented in the specified time, it may be necessary to reevaluate the status of your license.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a original license to this child care group home (capacity 7-12).
