Dear Guadalupe & Robert Cain:

This letter is a follow-up to the on-site inspection conducted at your home on 07/19/2023. The purpose of this inspection was to determine compliance with applicable licensing statutes and administrative rules for Family and Group Child Care Homes, specifically with regards to home maintenance and safety.

When I arrived for the onsite inspection, Mr. and Ms. Cain were present with eight child care children. A child was napping on a cot in each of the three bedrooms, one child was napping on a cot in the laundry room, one child was napping on a mat in the child use bathroom, two infants were napping in cribs in the dining area, and another infant was being picked up out of a crib by Ms. Cain as I walked in. The infant had been lying in a Boppy pillow and there was also a blanket in the crib. The infant appeared to have been napping, but Ms. Cain reported that she had just put him in there. An infant swing was also swinging next to the crib area and Ms. Cain said he had been in there. I reviewed safe sleep rules with Mr. and Ms. Cain, including that infants may not rest or sleep in anything but an approved sleep space, and may not rest or sleep within reach of any soft object, including blankets and Boppy pillows. I reminded Ms. Cain that her laundry room is not approved child use space and informed her that best practice is to not have children napping in a bathroom. There were no hazardous items found in the master bedroom. However, there is still a good amount of clutter, which inhibits the amount of space available and could be a falling hazard. Both of the other bedrooms continue to be safe and appropriate for children.

The violations found were:

R 400.1915 Indoor space; play equipment.

(2) Only space that has received prior approval for child use by the department may be used for child care.

Ms. Cain did not ensure only approved space is used for child care. She had a child napping in the laundry room, which is not approved space.

R 400.1932 Home maintenance and safety.

(2) All dangerous and hazardous materials or items must be stored securely and out of the reach of children.

Ms. Cain did not ensure that hazardous materials are stored securely out of reach of children. Laundry and cleaning supplies were within reach of a child in the laundry room.

During the exit conference, technical assistance/consultation was provided regarding the following:

- I reviewed safe sleep rules, including that infants may not rest or sleep in anything but an approved sleep space, and may not rest or sleep within reach of any soft object, including blankets and Boppy pillows.
- I reminded Mr. Cain that he must wash his and the child's hands immediately after changing a diaper, prior to documenting the diaper change or doing any other activity.
- Mr. and Mrs. Cain will continue to clean the master bedroom.

On 07/19/2023, you gave us an acceptable written corrective action plan.
