During the renewal inspection on 4/28/2023, I found 2 violations. The violations are listed below and explained in the attached report:

R 400.1916(1) Bedding and sleeping equipment
R 400.1934(4) Heating; ventilation; lighting; radon

Due to the violations, you must send us a corrective action plan by 4/25/2023. You can use our [corrective action plan](#) form or create your own.

If you need help writing the corrective action plan, please contact me. If you do not send a corrective action plan, you may face disciplinary action. The corrective action plan must include the following:

- How compliance with each rule will be achieved.
- Who is directly responsible for implementing the corrective action for each violation.
- Specific time frames for each violation as to when the correction will be completed or implemented.

- How continuing compliance will be maintained once compliance is achieved.
- The signature of the responsible party and a date.

Due to the infant safe sleep violation(s), all of your infant caregivers must take training on infant safe sleep. This must be included in your corrective action plan. In addition, a follow up inspection may be made to check compliance with the infant safe sleep rules.

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, a regular license will be issued. You will receive it in the mail.

Approved child use space: The main level kitchen, dining room, living room, family room, and two bedrooms are approved for child care. The lower level toy room and family room are approved for child care.

Exiting information (including second floor and basement): The front door leads to the garage and out to the front yard. The back door exits from the family room to the back yard. The basement is exited from the sliding doors and stairway leading to the main level of the home.

III. DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care home administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the home's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks, medical clearance information, and training information. Children's records include child information cards and child in care statements/receipts.

During the inspection, the child care home was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.1916 Bedding and sleeping equipment.

(6) Infants, birth to 12 months of age, shall rest or sleep alone in an approved crib, play yard, or porta-crib. This equipment must meet all of the following requirements:

(a) Cribs, porta-cris and play yards must comply with the product safety standards issued by the Consumer Product Safety Commission, 16 CFR 1219 (2019), 16 CFR 1220 (2019), and 16 CFR 1221 (2019), which are available at <http://www.cpsc.gov>. These standards are also available for inspection and distribution at the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Bureau of Community and Health Systems, Child Care Licensing Division, 611 W Ottawa, Lansing, MI 48933-1070.

Ms. Hesselink did not ensure that infants, birth to twelve months of age, rest or sleep in an approved crib, play yard, or porta-crib. An infant was napping in a Dock A Tot that is not approved sleeping equipment.

R 400.1934 Heating; ventilation; lighting; radon.

(4) A licensee shall test the child care home for the concentration of radon gas before the initial license is issued and every 4 years thereafter at the time of license renewal.

Ms. Hesselink did not ensure that a radon test was completed every 4 years at the time of renewal.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Upon receipt of an acceptable corrective action plan, I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care group home (capacity 7-14)
