While the surveyor was present, the director printed sections which were previously missing.

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1) An employee (DOH 06/11/15) criminal records check was not submitted timely according to KRS 199.896.
- 2) An employee's (DOH 06/11/15) central registry child abuse and neglect check for was not submitted timely according to 922 KAR 1:470. While the surveyor was present, this staff person was observed scrubbing walls in the center. During an interview with the staff person, she stated that she had never worked alone with children since being employed in June 2015. During a later interview, the director stated that the employee had never worked alone in supervision of children.
- 3) An employee's (DOH 05/22/15) file presented for review did not contain a criminal record check to include the state of Ohio where the staff graduated high school in 2012. During an interview, the director confirmed that this staff person had worked alone in supervision of children.

- 2) An employee (DOH 06/11/15) file presented for review did not contain negative tuberculin results. During an interview, the director stated that the employee had not yet received the TB test at this time.
