922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
1. High school diploma;
2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation presented, the surveyor found the following:

- The surveyor was not presented with documentation of education in the form of a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential for a staff member (DOH: 10/07/20).
- The surveyor was not presented with documentation of education in the form of a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential for a staff member (DOH: 09/22/20).

(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:

- (a) Posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group and followed;
- (b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;
- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
- (d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities including:

- 1. Art or music;
- 2. Math or numbers;
- 3. Dramatic play;
- 4. Stories and books;
- 5. Science or nature;
- 6. Block building or stacking;
- 7. Tactile or sensory activity;
- 8. Multi-cultural exposure;
- 9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;
- 10. A balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity;
- 11. An opportunity for a child to:
 - a. Have some free choice of activities;
 - b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation presented, the surveyor found in the Infant Room, the posted program of activities was dated 12/14/2020 – 12/18/2020; therefore, lesson plans were not updated as required.

(7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:

- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the classroom, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A broom and dustpan were next to the restroom door in the One's Classroom where they were accessible to any mobile children.
- 2. The soap bottle located on the restroom sink, had the words "Keep Out of Reach of Children".

540 - Premises Requirements

(1) The premises shall be:

- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the center, the surveyor found the hallway leading to the back play area had a jump rope located on the floor. The jump rope is a tripping hazard to the children going to the play area.

(10) When a child is diapered, the child shall:

- (b) Be placed on a surface that is:
 - 1. Clean;
 - 2. Padded;
 - 3. Free of holes, rips, tears, or other damage;
 - 4. Nonabsorbent;
 - 5. Easily cleaned; and
 - 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the classroom, the surveyor found debris underneath the diaper-changing pad located on the changing table in the One's Classroom.

(11) While bottle feeding a child, the:

- (a) Child shall be held; and**
- (b) Bottle or beverage container shall not be:**
 - 1. Propped;**
 - 2. Left in the mouth of a sleeping child; or**
 - 3. Heated in a microwave.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the classroom, the surveyor found a child sleeping in the Infant Room, with a bottle located in the crib beside the child.

(16) A weekly menu shall be:

- (a) Prepared;**
- (b) Dated;**
- (c) Posted in advance in a conspicuous place;**

Findings:

General: Based on observation during a tour of the classroom, the surveyor found a menu in the One's classroom, that was dated for 02/08/2021 – 02/12/2021; therefore, the menu was not updated as required.

1260 - Emergency Regulation

922 KAR 2:410E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation presented and observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1) A staff member did not have a completed background check.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:410E

Section 11. Safety and Background Check Requirements. (5) New staff shall: (a) Undergo name-based background checks upon hiring; (b) Not be left alone with children until the name-based background checks have been approved and returned; and (c) Undergo fingerprint-based background checks pursuant to 911 KAR 2:280 once the checks are operational again.

- 2) The temperature of the surveyor was not taken before the surveyor was permitted entry into the child-care center. During interview, the staff stated that they were aware that they needed to take the surveyor's temperature upon entrance to the center; however, staff stated they do take temperatures of staff before entering the child-care center.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:410E

Section 7. Screening and Illness Requirements. (1) Children and adults shall be screened for fever and contagious symptoms upon entry into the child care center or family child care home each day and shall not be allowed to enter if displaying a contagious fever or symptom of COVID-19.
