(1) A director shall:	
(l) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;	
Findings:	
General: Based on observation and interview, a ten (10) month old child received several long, red abrasions to both sides of her neck on 07/15/2020. Based on interview with the staff, at approximately 10:45am she cleaned the child up after eating food, put a new diaper on her but no clothes and placed her in a sleep sack. The staff stated that she clipped the child's pacifier to her diaper, put two lovey blankets inside the sleep sack with the child and zipped the sleep sack all the way to the top. The staff person stated that she placed the child on her back in the crib at approximately 11:00am and started cleaning the classroom. The staff stated after approximately twenty (20) minutes she checked on the child. The child had rolled over onto her stomach and was asleep with her bottom in the air. She stated that the pacifier was in the child's mouth and the pacifier clip was under her neck but she could not see the entire pacifier clip since she was on her stomach. Staff stated approximately fifteen (15) minutes later the child woke up crying so she picked her up and rocked her in the rocking chair. Staff stated that she never noticed any red marks on the child's neck at that time. Staff stated that another child needed her attention so she placed the child she was holding into a swing and buckled her in around her waist. Staff stated that approximately ten (10) minutes later she noticed that the child had fallen asleep in the swing so she unbuckled her and picked her up to place her back in the crib when she noticed the red marks to her neck. Staff stated that she immediately called to the front office for assistance. The child was taken to the doctor the following day and was told by a physician that the abrasions were likely caused by the pacifier clip.

(3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:	
(a) For an infant:	
3. No loose bedding, such as a bumper or a blanket; and	
4. No toys or other items except the infant's pacifier;	
Findings:	
General: Based on observation and interview, a staff person stated that after lunch she cleaned a ten (10) month old child, put on a clean diaper and put the child inside of a sleep sack. The staff stated that she clipped the child's pacifier clip to her diaper and placed two lovey security blankets down inside the sleep sack and zipped the sleep sack up all the way. The staff stated that she then placed the child in her crib. Per licensing regulations, there are to be no loose bedding, toys or other items in the crib except for the pacifier.
