922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.
(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:
(d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities including the following:
12. Use of electronic viewing and listening devices if the:
a. Material is appropriate to the child using the equipment;
b. Material does not include any violence, adult content viewing, or inappropriate language;
c. Viewing or individual listening is limited to two (2) hours per day;
d. Viewing or listening is discussed with parents prior to viewing or listening; and
e. Viewing or listening is designed as an educational tool.
(5) A child who does not wish to use the electronic devices during the planned program shall be offered other appropriate activities.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, music with adult content played on the radio in the younger infants' room.

485 - Infant Sleep Position **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.
(1) An infant shall sleep or nap on the infant's back unless the infant's health professional signs a waiver that states the infant requires an alternate sleeping position.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, three (3) infants each slept in a crib that was raised into an alternate sleeping position in the younger infants' room. The center did not have a signed waiver from a health professional stating each infant required an alternate sleep position.

 - (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a black adult-size coat hung on the divider wall between the preschool I and preschool II classrooms and was accessible to the children.

570 - Pest Control

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, several ants were on the sink in the infants' classroom.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

- (9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, food and dirt were present on the floor in the preschool II classroom. A large blue area rug was heavily stained in the preschool II classroom. A multi-colored area rug was heavily stained in the toddlers' classroom. In addition, a safari animal rug was heavily stained in the older infants' classroom.

650 - Toilet

- (4) Each toilet shall:
 - (a) Be kept in clean condition;
 - (b) Be kept in good repair;
 - (c) Be in a lighted room; and

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a toilet was not flushed and had urine visible in the boys restroom adjacent to the preschool classroom.

 - 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
 - 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
 - a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
 - b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
 - d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
 - 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
 - (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
 - (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a bottle of cefprozil medication was stored unlocked in the refrigerator in the older infants' classroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, black fabric weed block was raised approximately two (2) inches above the protective surface material and created a tripping hazard throughout the outdoor playground.

755 - Protective Surface

(21) A protective surface shall:

- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:**
 - 1. Climb;**
 - 2. Swing; and**

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, a Little Tikes climbing/sliding apparatus had dirt underneath on the toddlers' playground. There was no protective surface present underneath six (6) swings, a slide and a climbing apparatus on the older children's outdoor playground.

 - 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, three (3) crib sheets were soiled with a wet substance on three crib mattresses in the younger infants' classroom. Surveyor observed a child placed on a crib mattress that had a soiled sheet on it.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, chipped and flaked paint was on the reading lofts in the preschool I classroom and in the in the preschool II classroom. A black adult chair was torn and foam exposed in the toddlers' classroom.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

(2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:

- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;**

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:415E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the center failed to assure each infant and toddler did not share toys unless the toys are cleaned and sanitized before shared between children. Two (2) infant children were observed laying on a thirty (30) inch by thirty-two (32) inch Lay and Play activity gym mat together in the nursery room1.
