- (2.) The Three Years Old Classroom contained one (1) electrical outlet with no protective covering.
- (3.) A broom and dust pan were accessible to the children in the Three Years Old Classroom.

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE – TRIS, the surveyor found that staff (DOH: 12/23/14) obtained two (2) of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet – approved early care and education training.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

(1.) The lesson plan for the Two Years Old Classroom was dated for 2/19/18. During interview, the staff in the classroom reported that was the most recent lesson plan available.

(2.) The surveyor did not observe any form of programming in the Two Years Old Classroom or the Three Years Old Classroom. Children were observed to be in chaos while throwing toys and climbing on book shelves with no re-direction from the staff present in the classroom.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a six-month-old infant wearing a bib while sleeping in a crib.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following in the Three Years Old Classroom:

- (1.) There was a hole in the door when entering the classroom.
- (2.) A piece of wood trim was broken on the corner of the wall where the hand washing sink is located.
- (3.) A sharp piece of wood trim was exposed in the window where the trim was broken.
- (4.) Several dirty paper towels were observed to be thrown on the floor around the hand washing sink.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that a staff in the Nursery did not wash a child's hands after changing the child's diaper.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that a staff did not wash their hands after changing a child's diaper in the Nursery. After the diaper change, the staff immediately placed the child's pacifier inside the child's mouth without washing their hands.

 - 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found debris underneath the diaper changing pad in the Two Years Old Classroom.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that a staff did not disinfect the diapering surface after changing a child's diaper in the Nursery.

2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;

3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:

a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;

b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;

c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and

d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or

4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;

(b) Kept in the original bottle; and

(c) Properly labeled.

(7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a prescription for saline nasal drops and over-the-counter gas relief drops were not in a locked place in the Nursery. The medications were inside a child's cubby. During interview, staff reported that medications are typically not in a locked container as they are placed inside the child's cubby. The cubbies were out of reach of the children; however, the medications were not stored in a separate and locked place.
