355 - Parent Notification

(m) Notify the parent immediately of an accident or incident requiring medical treatment of a child;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the video shows a four-year-old child running across the classroom and trip over his feet causing him to fall. He hit the side of his head and face on the edge of a table. This fall caused an immediate bruise on the child's face. There were two (2) staff members in the classroom when the child fell. Neither staff member contacted the child's parents to notify them of the injury. Based on interview, both staff members stated they did not think the injury was serious even though neither of them are in the medical field. An ice pack was given to the child and the child did take a nap. The following day the bruising had spread up the child's face and around his eye. Mom took the child to the UK clinic, and the medical personnel was concerned with the size of the bruise.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:

- (a) Posted in writing in a conspicuous location with each age group and followed;
- (b) Of activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served;
- (c) That provides experience to promote the individual child's physical, emotional, social, and intellectual growth and well-being; and
- (d) Unless the child-care center is a before- or after-school program that operates part day or less, that offers a variety of creative activities

including:

- 1. Art or music;
- 2. Math or numbers;
- 3. Dramatic play;
- 4. Stories and books;
- 5. Science or nature;
- 6. Block building or stacking;
- 7. Tactile or sensory activity;
- 8. Multi-cultural exposure;
- 9. Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles;
- 10. A balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity;
- 11. An opportunity for a child to:
 - a. Have some free choice of activities;
 - b. If desired, play apart from the group at times;

Findings:

One (1) staff member was seen sitting in a chair up against a bookshelf working on classroom paperwork. The second staff member was standing with her back to the classroom at a window sill working on classroom artwork. Both teachers were near a round table in the classroom. Starting at 10:05:42am to 10:06:32am all four (4) children were seen running back and forth from the reading area over to the round table mentioned. At no time do the teachers look up from what they were doing or turn around to stop the children from running. At 10:06:32am one (1) of the children ran towards the round table and tripped over his own feet falling forward, hitting the side of his face/head on the edge of the table. He received an injury to his face. It is evident by reviewing the video that there was no type of programming or structure of activities going on in the classroom.
