General: Based on review of documentation, three staff members had PAHT (Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma) training that had exceeded five years, and therefore was no longer current.	
1. Staff member hired 11/4/16, had a PAHT training that expired 6/15/19. 2. Staff member hired 6/17/2015, had a PAHT training that expired 9/22/19. 3. Staff member hired 5/29/2012, had a PAHT that expired 12/27/2018.	
A review of ECE-TRIS supports these findings. It is important to note that the dates of expiration were not within the COVID-19 closure timeframe.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the cabinet under the sink outside of the school-aged classroom had a latch that was not fastened. The unlatched cabinet stored Windex. The warning label on this chemical read, "Keep out of reach of children." This item was accessible to the children in care.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview during an inspection of the refrigerator outside of the school-aged classroom, the surveyor observed a locked medication box storing two cartridges of injectable medication, which were not properly labeled. The surveyor asked the staff member in the school-age classroom who the medication belonged to, and the staff member did not know. After speaking with another staff member, it was determined that the medication belonged to a staff member.

General: Based on observation, two crib sheets in the infant classroom were loosely fitted to the crib mattress. This poses a suffocation hazard.
