Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that a fingerprint background check had been initiated for a staff member with a rehire date of 08/20/18. Observation of the Infant room revealed two electrical cords, one of which was unplugged from an outlet, laying on the floor by the bouncer seats, creating a risk of entanglement or strangulation for the infants who were crawling near that area.</p> | |

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the staff member in charge did not present verification that the files for staff members with hire dates of 08/20/18 and 08/28/18 contained a current statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the preschool classroom revealed a staff member's cell phone was accessible to the children in care.

540 - Premises Requirements

(1) The premises shall be:

- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;**
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Infant room revealed a section of a baseboard was missing, exposing peeling paint and drywall near the cribs. Observation of the Twos room revealed baseboards peeling from the wall near the window and in the dramatic play area.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Infant room revealed a brown circular stain on a ceiling tile above the changing table. Observation of the Ones room revealed paint peeling on an orange wall behind the high chairs. Observation of the bathroom in the Preschool room revealed a hole in a floor tile near the door.

 - b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;**
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;**
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;**
- 4. After handling animals;**
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and**
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and**
- (c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Ones room revealed a child's hands were not washed with soap and warm running water after a diaper change.

660 - Staff Hygiene/Handwashing

 - 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;**
 - 3. Before and after diapering each child;**

(d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Ones room revealed a staff member did not wash her hands with soap and warm running water after a diaper change.

685 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with hygienic practices in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Ones room revealed the changing pad was not sanitized after a diaper change.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the playground revealed a hole, approximately two (2) feet deep and five (5) inches in diameter, cut into the concrete under a gutter, creating a tripping hazard for the children in care.

- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:**
 - a. Weekly; or**
 - b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Infant room revealed two (2) of the eight (8) cribs had loose-fitting sheets.

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
 - (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
 - (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Threes room revealed a child sized Mickey Mouse couch was heavily soiled.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
 - (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
 - (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
 - (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
 - (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the playground revealed the large plastic eyes of a Little Tykes riding car were broken off, exposing sharp plastic pieces to the children in care. Continued observation of the playground revealed an accumulation of dirt in a blue and pink playhouse.

825 - Toys

 - (b) Durable; and
 - (c) Without sharp points or edges.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Ones room revealed the three (3) bucket seats in the feeding table had slots for seat straps; however, all of the seat straps were missing. Observation of the Infant room revealed a high chair had slots for straps; however, the seat straps were missing.

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the Infant room revealed a staff member fed a bottle to an infant who was sitting in a high chair. Interview with the staff member revealed the infant was five (5) months old.

1040 - Kitchen Equipment Clean and Sanitary

- (7) The following shall be clean and sanitary:
 - (a) Eating and drinking utensils;
 - (b) Kitchenware;
 - (c) Food contact surfaces of equipment;

 - (f) Cooking surfaces of equipment; and
 - (g) Nonfood contact surfaces of equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the kitchen revealed food debris and dead gnats in the freezer.
