General: Based on observation and interview, nine (9) children were present in the two and three-year-olds' classroom. The square footage of the two and three-year-olds' room was 220 square feet which allowed for six (6) children to have thirty-five (35) square feet of space.

In addition, the hot water temperature registered eighty-five (85) degrees Fahrenheit at the sink immediately adjacent to the kitchen.

**Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:415E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.**

**Findings:**

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the center failed to assure all child care staff, directors, owners and operators complete a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of reopening, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:415E. Two (2) staff members hired 04/06/13, and 08/01/20, failed to complete the mandatory training.
