<p>922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.</p> <p>(1) A licensee shall:</p> <p>(a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and</p> <p>(b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.</p> <p>Findings:</p> <p>General: Based on observation and interview, a seven-month-old infant's left leg was stuck between the slats of a crib for approximately sixteen minutes. As a result, the child's leg was bruised behind her knee and inner and outer thigh.</p> <p>A review of video footage recorded on 2/8/2021 at 11:49 a.m., found the infant lying on her right side, and while trying to roll over, she put her left leg through the slats of the crib. The child could be seen crying and struggling to move her right arm from underneath her body and struggling to free her leg.</p> <p>Two staff who were working in the classroom, were observed (on video) to walk by the infant, but they appeared not to notice that the infant had her leg stuck. At 12:05 p.m., a staff person finally saw the infant struggling and removed her from the crib. The staff person stated that she had to manipulate the child's leg for approximately ten seconds in order to free her from the crib.</p> <p>The incident was not reported to the child's parents on the day it occurred. The staff person stated that she did not think the incident would cause bruising. An incident report was completed three days later, after the parent inquired about the bruises.</p>

No toys or other items except the infant's pacifier;</p> <p>Findings:</p> <p>General: Based on observation of video footage recorded on 2/8/2021, the surveyor found that a blanket was placed inside crib with a seven-month-old infant.</p>
