(1) A director shall:	
(l) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;	
Findings:	
General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Interview revealed that a child jumped from a fence, and landed onto an up-turned metal rake, imbedding a prong into the underside of his barefoot which required medical attention due to the depth of the puncture. Interview also revealed the rake and other gardening tools were used upon the request of a child and not as a part of an activity. A review of documentation revealed the prong was removed from the child's foot by the victim. Observation revealed the child had jumped approximately 6 inches from the fence onto the rake. Observation also revealed a metal and wood shovel containing sharp edges. Interview revealed the rake has been disposed of.

525 - Items Accessible Only During Activity	Not In Compliance
922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.	
(8) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care unless under direct supervision and part of planned program of instruction:	
(a) Knives and sharp objects;	
(b) Litter and rubbish;	
(c) Bar soap; and	
(d) Plastic bags not used for personal belongings.	
Findings:	
General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Interview with staff revealed a child jumped from approximately 6 inches onto a metal rake, imbedding a prong of the rake into his foot which required medical attention. The victim pulled the rake's prong from his foot. Interview revealed the prong of the rake was sharp enough to enter the inside of the child's foot. Additional interview revealed the rake was a part of a gardening set including a shovel and wheelbarrows, which the children used frequently for digging worms. The rake was not a part of a planned activity with direct supervision.
